

– Muraflex ADA Compliance Statement

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ensures access to the built environment for people with disabilities. The ADA Standards establish design requirements for the construction and alteration of facilities subject to the law. These enforceable standards apply to places of public accommodation, commercial facilities, and state and local government facilities.

The Access Board is responsible for developing and updating design guidelines known as the ADA Accessibility Guidelines (ADAAG). These guidelines are used by the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of Transportation (DOT) in setting enforceable standards that the public must follow. Both DOJ's and DOT's current ADA Standards are based on the Board's updated ADAAG (2004). As a result, for the most part, these two sets of standards are very similar. However, each contains additional requirements that are specific to the facilities covered by the respective agencies. These additional requirements define the types of facilities covered, set effective dates, and provide additional scoping or technical requirements for those facilities. DOJ's ADA Standards apply to all facilities except public transportation facilities, which are subject to DOT's ADA Standards. The edition of the ADA Standards provided here on the Board's website includes DOJ's and DOT's additional provisions.

All Muraflex doors, including single frameless pivot MIMO, single sliding MIMO, single sliding FINO, single framed pivot, double pivot and double sliding FINO, are fully ADA compliant. All aforementioned doors and/or systems abide by ADAAG codes and are fully ADA compliant in that the door, the clearance and the hardware comply with all applicable codes of section 404 of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Accessibility Guidelines as stipulated by the United States Access Board. This includes Maneuvering Clearance (404.2.4), Smooth Surface (404.2.10), Thresholds (404.2.5), Hardware (404.2.7), Opening Force (404.2.9), Closing Speed (404.2.8), and Vision/Side Lights (as applicable_) (404.2.11).

All Muraflex systems fully comply with all ADAAG codes. Muraflex is not responsible for assessing the need for special ADA requirements, ensuring that the installation site is ADA compliant, nor for assessing special ADA requirements on the site.
